For lunchtime, we had a picnic near the sea. The temperature was likeable.

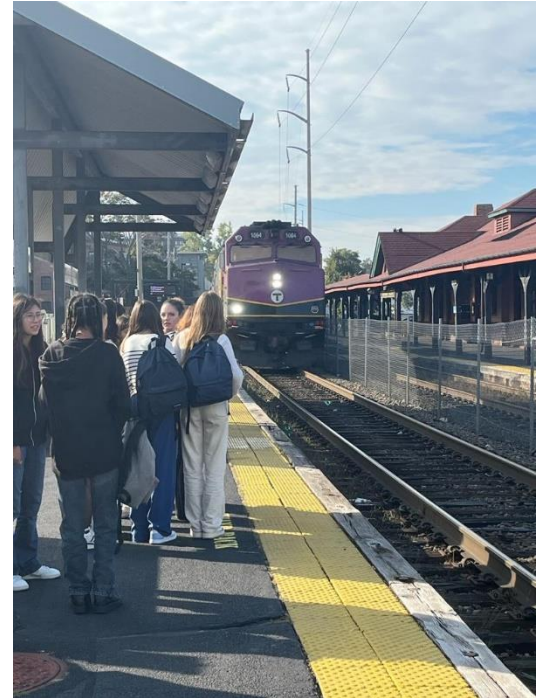
Not far from where we had lunch, there was the Fisherman Memorial. It is a huge statue which represented a fisherman in memory to the
